	<p>RECORDS OF THE ECONOMIC STABILIZATION PROGRAM, 1971-74</p> <p>The various agencies of the Economic Stabilization Program were established by a series of Executive Orders and were based on the Economic Stabilization Act of 1970 (84 Stat. 799), as amended. The overall purpose of the Program was to achieve and maintain wage and price stability. All ESP agencies terminated July 1, 1974. This disposal request consists of case files documenting communication between the agencies and business entities seeking wage and price determinations. (General files dealing with the policies, programs, decisions, and actions of the agencies will be in the custody of the Department of the Treasury as of January 1, 1975.).</p>		
1	<p><u>Case Files of the Economic Stabilization Program, 1971-1974</u></p> <p>Consist of individual folders containing both forms submitted by business entities required to report to agencies of the Program and related memoranda and other papers of the agencies. The case files relate mainly to applications for wage and price determinations.</p> <p>(a) Case files selected by NARS and the ESP agencies that set precedent or are historically or politically significant. (This sample should not exceed 1% of the total cases.).</p>
