

	<p><u>World War II Nuclear, Biological Warfare, and Chemical Warfare Files, 46 feet, 1920 - 1950.</u> Reports, studies, bulletins, manuals, and correspondence pertaining to chemical warfare, biological warfare, and nuclear weapons. While the collection covers the period 1920 - 1950, it is heavily concentrated on World War II, with Germany and Japan the subject countries. Included in the file are histories of German jet propulsion development at Peenemunde, studies on captured Nazi toxic munitions, and the effects of the atomic bomb on Nagasaki.</p> <p>The collection was transferred to DIA from Edgewood Arsenal. The files are arranged alpha-numerically, and thereunder by country originating the information or the subject country, and thereunder by sequential number. The file contains 21 cubic feet of Confidential records and 9 cubic feet of Secret records. The remainder is unclassified. <u>Disposition:</u> Permanent. Transfer immediately to the National Archives.</p>
