1.	<p>Foreign jurisdiction case files. FN. 405-02.</p> <p>Foreign jurisdiction case files. Documents relating to civil or criminal trial and confinement of individuals subject to the court-martial jurisdiction of the Army by foreign courts or foreign administrative agencies. Included are individual case reports on the exercise of criminal jurisdiction by foreign tribunals, trial observer reports, requests for local authorities to refrain from exercising their criminal jurisdiction, and communications with staff judge advocates, DA, diplomatic missions, and other organizations.</p> <p>Disposition: OTJAG and Overseas Commands where applicable: Destroy after 30 years. Cut off annually following acquittal, fine, reprimand, dropping of charges, or on completion of sentence, as applicable.</p> <p>Reason for change: A thirty-year retention period appears to be justifiable, in as much as military personnel subject to the exercise of foreign criminal jurisdiction often receive sentences in excess of ten years. It is essential that documentation relating thereto be preserved in order to respond to litigation in the Federal Courts and to answer queries from Congress, individuals concerned, or other interested persons.</p>
