1	<p>BACKGROUND: Public Law 94-553, dated 19 Oct 1976 has changed the duration of a copyright from 28 years first term and 28 years second term to 28 years first term and 47 years second term for copyrights issued between 1950 and December 31, 1977, and life of author plus 50 years for copyrights issued after 1 January 1978. A change is needed in our disposition instructions, because we now have "Destroy after 56 years" which represents the old law of 28 plus 28. The Army Judge Advocate General has concurred with our proposed disposition instructions.</p> <p><u>406-08 Copyright license and assignment files</u></p> <p>DESCRIPTION: Documents showing interests of the Government in or under copyrights procured or obtained on behalf of the DA whether or not recorded in the office of the Register of Copyrights. SECTION III – APPRAISER'S COMMENTS

Public Law 94-553 (10/19/1976) provided for a significant lengthening of the copyright privilege. To meet this legal requirement, the Department of the Army is revising the retention periods for its copyright-related records. In this disposition request, Army proposes to extend from 56 years to 150 years the retention period for Copyright License and Assignment Files, FN 406-08. I recommend approval. Neither GAO nor NNM concurrence is required.
