## SECTION III - APPRAISER'S COMMENTS

These four accessions consist of outdated copies of field survey and test records, grading and analysis sheets, copies of blueprints of Navy buildings, time sheets, travel orders, and other records of a transitory nature. The arrangement of the records does not lend itself to readily-discernible subjects. In many instances, it appears the materials were simply thrown into the boxes without rhyme or reason. These accessions lack research value, and their immediate destruction is recommended. Diane Nixon, Director of the Los Angeles Archives Branch, concurs in this evaluation.

The records in this disposal job relate to the construction of naval facilities on the west coast. They cover such phases of construction as soil and water sampling, the testing of building materials such as concrete, the design of buildings, and the installation of such building systems as heating and ventilation. The records are dated 1946-69.

Some of these records may have value to the Navy as long as the installations are still owned and occupied by the Navy. They clearly have no permanent archival value to document the primary mission and activities of the Department of the Navy. They are facilitative in nature and are of possible value only to the originating agency.

I recommend approval of this job.

This job, which I initiated shortly before leaving the Laguna Niguel Federal Records Center, pertains to field survey, test and exploration records retired under Item 11013(2) of SECNAVINST P5212.5B. As is well-known, this schedule was not approved by the Archivist of the United States. The four accessions listed in the job and scheduled as permanent by the Navy serve to underscore both the weaknesses in the schedule itself and the manner in which records were transferred to the centers in the 1960's.

The records in these accessions are routine and have long since outlived their usefulness. It should be further noted that, included with these Shore Station construction records, are records of an even more transitory nature, such as time sheets, invoices and travel orders, and non-record materials, such as extra copies of pamphlets and publications.

Given the age of these records and their lack of arrangement, the disposition recommendation of immediate destruction seems reasonable. However, because of environmental and pollution concerns, the Navy may wish to retain certain water quality and sewage system records from these accessions. We would be amenable to such a suggestion.

Samples from the four accessions are included with this job which clearly illustrate their non-archival nature. This job will be sent to NNS, NNA and NNM for their concurrence.



Enclosed is a Request for Records Disposition Authority (SF-115) for four accessions of field survey, test and exploration records accumulated by the Naval Facilities Engineering Command, San Diego. These accessions are currently stored at the Los Angeles Federal Records Center, consist of 61 cubic feet, and are unclassified. The records cover the years 1944 - 1969.

Although the San Diego Facilities Command undoubtedly created a great many records of enduring interest, these particular accessions should not have been retired as permanently valuable. For the most part, these files consist of outdated copies of sewage system studies; water tests; soil boring tests; laboratory equipment pamphlets and publications; copies of travel orders for personnel working on facilities projects; grading and analysis sheets for runways and taxi ways; time sheets and invoices; and copies of blueprints of buildings at North Island NAS, San Diego. When NIR staffers Dick MacKay and Nancy Miller visited us in September 1985, they indicated their belief that the originals for such blueprints should be stored at the Naval Facilities and Engineering Command in Alexandria, Virginia.

The arrangement of these accessions does not lend itself to readily-discernible subjects, as in fact was noted on the transmittal for 181-63A092. Immediate disposal of these accessions is recommended. The Director of the Los Angeles Archives Branch, Diane Nixon, has also examined these records and concurs in this evaluation.
