	<p align="center">RECORD GROUP 313, RECORDS OF NAVAL OPERATING FORCES</p> <p>The records of the U. S. Naval Support Force, Antarctica, (USNSFA) proposed for disposal are part of a polar subgroup of Record Group 313. In March 1955 the President announced that the United States would participate in the International Geophysical Year (1957-58) and join other nations to carry out scientific projects in Antarctica. The Navy was assigned the role of supporting the scientific work in Antarctica and established USNSFA and Task Force 43. In November 1955 the first deployment of USNSFA surface, air, and construction units began in what was to be called OPERATION DEEPFREEZE. Support for the international Geophysical Year Projects continued in 1956-57, 1957-58, and 1958-59. Thereafter, USNSFA continued to support the United States Antarctic Research Program. The records described below as items 1-4 constitute 81 cubic feet of records. As a result of the reappraisal contemplated when the communications files were accessioned, these records are disposable because they relate to low level administrative and logistics activities, are incomplete sets or duplicates, and do not contribute sufficiently to the documentation of USNSFA or other activities to warrant their continued retention.</p>		<i>4 items</i>
