Item 1. National Police Infrastructure Analysis Subsystem I: Gazeteer

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

<u>Description:</u> A geographical description of South Vietnam, both GVN

and VC controlled, basic for the uniform construction

of the National Police Files.

Evaluation: This gazeteer for subsystem I is duplicated by a gaze-

teer for subsystem II, which will be used as documen-

tation for both.

Item 2. National Police Identification Followup Subsystem.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: Contains information about known and suspected VC agents,

and was used by the National Police Force to plan counter-

measures.

Evaluation: The data is duplicated in the NPIASS-II subseries which

has been recommended for accession.

Item 3. VNAF Personnel Automated Accounting System (tapes 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: These tapes are unreadable. Tapes 2,3 and 4 are described

in Item #16.

Evaluation: These tapes are unreadable.

Item 4. Weekly Intelligence Estimate Update System.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: An automated record of enemy attacks and friendly

activities resulting in contact involving Regional and

Popular Forces.

Evaluation: Data is duplicated in the Territorial Forces Activity

Reporting System, which is accessioned and available

to the public.

Item 5. Force and Material Reporting System.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: Provides unit strengths, location and logistics infor-

mation for all units in strategic reserve or otherwise not stationed in-country, but under the command of MACV

headquarters. It was used to plan for emergency deployment, redeployment and withdrawal actions.

<u>Evaluation:</u> This series has extremely limited coverage (February to

May 1972.e) It has relevance only to the planning for the eventual United States withdrawal from Vietnam in 1973. There are no historical or statistical reasons

to accession this series.

Item 6. Aircraft Inventory System.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: A system to keep track of aircraft (not known which or

how many) in Vietnam to forecast scheduled maintenance and to maintain an up-to-date inventory. (December 1972

to February 1973).

Evaluation: Information is on data systems maintained in the United

States, which will be eventually offered for accession to NNR. In addition to being duplicated in other files, there is insufficient documentation to use the file.

Finally, it has extremely limited coverage.

Item 7. Central Munitions System.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: Included ammunition assets by place and unit, receipts,

transfers and expenditures. (1965-1972).

Evaluation: Though potentially a valuable data base that would

provide a record of ammunition expenditures and other logistical information, four input tapes provided little or no data and the two data files were missing

at the time of the inventory.

Item 8. Medevac Control Roster System.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: Provides personnel information on all medical evacuees

leaving Vietman for medical treatment. (January 1967

(est) to December 1972.e)

Evaluation: Potentially a valuable tool which could be linked to

other personnel and casualty lists, the data on the

tape received only one quarterly report of 3,434 evacuees out of a possible 70,000 for the entire period.

Item 9. Operation Keystone Requirements.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: Contains technical items of equipment stocked by

American supply depots that could be turned over to the South Vietnamese armed forces. (August 1970 to

October 1972).

Evaluation: The data tape received with this series was blank.

Item 10. MACV Joint Table of Distribution System.

Recommendation: Destroy immediately.

Description: An automated construction of the make-up, by positions

and spaces, of the MACV headquarters. (September 1968

to February 1973)e

Evaluation: This small series (2572 records) can be linked with

other data concerning the US buildup of forces in 1965

and the eventual "drawdown" of forces in 1973.

Military historians could compare the assumption of responsibilities within the headquarters commensurate with the size of the personnel involved. It would also

contain "friendly order of battle" information.

Unfortunately, it has been written in a data base management system and would be of little benefit to researchers without expensive and time-consuming reformatting proce-

dures in NNR.
