1	<p>Narcotic Drug Registers, Inventory and Reports</p> <p>The purpose of these records is to comply with 21 CFR 1304 for the handling of the schedule I and schedule II narcotic drugs maintained on site for emergency use. Information includes - DEA registration number, type of drug, amount, exact location, dispensing information</p> <p>TEMPORARY Cut off at the end of the fiscal year in which new biennial inventory is complete. Destroy/delete 2 years after cut off</p> <p>NOTE These records are maintained on DOE/NNSA sites that have a Central Medical Facility. The services provided in the Central Medical Facility include dispensing Schedule I & II narcotics for emergency medical situations. According to 21 CFR 1304 these records must be maintained centrally and the exact locations must be identified. 21 CFR 1304.04 (a) states that every inventory and other records required to be kept under this part must be kept by the registrant and be available for at least 2 years from the date of such inventory or records, for inspection and copying by authorized employees of the Administration.</p>
