The records consist of lists of additives to tobacco products including the chemical name and number of each additive. The lists do not contain information on the percentages of the additives used in tobacco products, the name of the product, and the company which produces the product. The records/and or data contained in them are not released to the public in accordance with provisions in the above described legislation and those contained in the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) which prevent the release of trade secret data.

The records are organized chronologically by year and date from 1985 to the present. The records must be maintained in accordance with the legislation mentioned above and the possibility exists that they may be of interest in future litigation and research. The volume of the records is negligible (less than six inches) and the estimated annual accumulation is less than six inches of records per year.

Authorized Disposition

Transfer to the FRC when 20 years old or when volume warrants, whichever comes first. Destroy when 75 years old.

(Note: The records will be stored in secured areas at the FRC and access will be strictly controlled by a designated official of the Office on Smoking and Health, National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, Centers for Disease Control. This is in accordance with procedures specified under the Comprehensive Smoking Education Act of 1984 (15 USC 1331) and the Comprehensive Smokeless Tobacco Health Education Act of 1986 (15 USC 4401).
