### Background Information

Under Section 212(a)(4) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA), an individual seeking admission to the United States or seeking to adjust status to permanent resident (obtaining a green card) is inadmissible if the individual "at the time of application for admission or adjustment of status, is likely at any time to become a public charge. In determining inadmissibility, USCIS defines "public charge" as an individual who is likely to become "primarily dependent on the government for subsistence, as demonstrated by either the receipt of public cash assistance for income maintenance, or institutionalization for long-term care at government expense. In determining whether an alien meets this definition for public charge inadmissibility, a number of factors are considered, including age, health, family status, assets, resources, financial status, education, and skills. If an individual is inadmissible, admission to the United States or adjustment of status will not be granted.

USCIS uses the information the applicant provides as well as information gathered from third party agencies to grant or deny the immigration. Third party agencies include: Social Security Administration (SSA), U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), and Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to verify any public benefit provided by the government that the applicant requested or received from the agency. This would include the type of benefit, date(s) of receipt, and any information provided to the agency.

Form I-945, Public Charge Bond

Disposition Authority Number DAA-0566-2019-0024-0003

An immigration bond is a contract between the United States government (the obligee) and an individual or a company (the obligor) who pledges a sum of money to guarantee a set of conditions set by the government concerning the alien. For purposes of public charge bonds, the proposed Form I-945 (Public Charge Bond) outlines the set of conditions; it is the actual bond contract between the U.S. government and the obligor. The form is completed by the obligor who posts the bond on the alien's behalf.

The Form I-356, Request for Cancellation of Public Charge Bond is used when the obligor or co-obligor requests the cancellation of the bond that was submitted on Form I-945, Public Charge Bond, on behalf of an alien. The form is completed by the obligor and the alien. The form is completed to request the cancellation of the public charge form after the alien either naturalized, died, or permanently departed the United States, or when the bond must be substituted (expiration of the bond, if DHS accepted bond of limited duration), as outlined in proposed 8 CFR 213.1.
