The Immigration and Customs Enforcement Pattern Analysis and Information Collection System (ICEPIC) is a U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) system which may be used by any DHS law enforcement entity. Based on the need to know, the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) may share analytical reports generated from ICEPIC information with other parts of DHS including, both law enforcement and intelligence agencies. These may include:

- . DHS Operations Center
- . U.S. Secret Service
- . U.S. Coast Guard
- . U.S. Customs and Border Protection
- . Transportation Security Administration, and
- . Office of Intelligence and Analysis.

Organizations only receive information for which they are authorized to receive. Current users of ICEPIC include but are not limited to ICE:

- . ICE Office of Investigations
- . ICE Office of International Affairs
- . ICE Detention and Removal Office
- . ICE Office of Intelligence
- . USCIS: Fraud Detection & National Security Division
- . DHS/Intelligence and Analysis

ICEPIC allows ICE law enforcement investigators and analysts to look for non-obvious relationship patterns among individuals and organizations that are indicative of violations of the customs and immigration laws that are enforced by DHS agencies, as well as possible terrorist threats and plots. From these relationships, ICE investigators and analysts can develop specific leads and law enforcement intelligence for active and new investigations.

Relationship data is made up of information about how a place, person, or thing (e.g., automobile or other piece of property) relates to other persons, places, or things. For example, iCEPIC can determine relationship data about how certain events occurred at a certain address, or certain individuals under investigation who have shared the same address in the past.

In addition to ICE-owned systems, ENFORCE, National Security Entry-Exit Registration System (NSEERS), and Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS (N1-563-04-1)), ICEPIC receives information through direct electronic submission or manual upload from CD- or DVD-ROMs from the following:

A. Master File/Data

(1) Biographical Information, Biometric Information, Prior Law Enforcement Encounter Information, and Relationship Information

ICEPIC maintains biographical and biometric information obtained from individuals during DHS enforcement encounters or provided by individuals when applying for U.S. immigration benefits or admission to the U.S. Biographical data includes name, aliases, date of birth, phone numbers, addresses, and nationality; biometric information includes fingerprints and photographs. Prior law enforcement encounter information consists of data related to an individual's case, including immigration history, alien registration information, and other identification or record numbers. Relationship information identified using ICEPIC discovers possible non-abvious relationships among individuals and organizations that are indicative of violations of the customs and immigration laws as well as possible terrorist threats and plots.

Disposition:

TEMPORARY. Cutoff at end of calendar year of last use of individual's data. Delete fifteen (15) years after cutoff, unless information has become relevant to a legal action.
