	<p align="center"><b><u>OFFICIAL RECORDS OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL</u></b></p> <p>The major functions of the Solicitor General's Office are to: supervise the handling of Government litigation in the Supreme Court of the United States; determine in which cases the Government should seek Supreme Court review; assign the oral argument of all government cases, either to himself, to members of his staff, to attorneys in other divisions of the Justice Department, or to attorneys in other departments or agencies of the Federal Government; prepare pleadings and briefs for the Supreme Court; receive from the appellate sections of the Department of Justice recommendations on whether to appeal cases lost in the trial courts; review all cases lost by the Department in lower courts to determine whether they should be appealed to the next higher tribunal.</p>
