The memorandum requested an inquiry to determine whether the FBI investigation of the assassination of Dr. King was thorough and unbiased; and, whether there was evidence of FBI involvement in the assassination and if so did that involvement warrant criminal prosecution or other appropriate action.</p> <p>The report includes appendices composed of documents referred to in the body, interview memoranda and attorneys' work notes.
