One medal is known as the Young American Medal for Bravery. It is awarded for an act of excep- tional courage or extraordinary decision in an effort to save or successfully saving the life of any person whose life was in actual imminent danger. The other medal is known as the Young American Medal for Service. It is awarded to an individual who achieved unusual recognition or whose character and service is considered out- standing. The medals are awarded annually. The recipients must be eighteen years old or under and be re- commended by the governor of one of the fifty states, Puerto Rico, Guam or the Virgin Islands.
