1.	<p>Young American Awards Records</p> <p>Public Law 638 of the 81st. Congress, approved August 3, 1950, authorizes and directs the Department of Justice(DOJ) to establish two medals to be awarded to outstanding young Americans. One medal is known as the Young American Medal for Bravery. It is awarded for an act of exceptional courage or extraordinary decision in an effort to save or successfully saving the life of any person whose life was in actual imminent danger. The other medal is known as the Young American Medal for Service. It is awarded to an individual who achieved unusual recognition or whose character and service is considered outstanding.</p> <p>The medals are awarded annually. The recipients must be eighteen years old or under and be recommended by the governor of one of the fifty states, Puerto Rico, Guam or the Virgin Islands.</p> <p>These files consist of correspondence and support documents related to the recommendation, evaluation and award of the medals. Included also is correspondence related to the establishment of the award and the development of the</p>
