The U.S. Trustees commenced operations on October 1, 1979. The program will lapse in April 1984, unless extended by Congress before that time. The U.S. Trustees are employees of the Department of Justice. The files that are created are for administrative purposes and do not constitute the official bankruptcy case file.
