1.	Files of the Civil Division, Torts Branch, consisting of administrative claim files which were filed against the United States as a result of an allegation of personal injury or death arising out of the administration of vaccine under the swine flu immunization program of 1976, Public Law 94-380. Statutes governing these claims are 42 U.S.C. 247b(j)-(1), 28 U.S.C. 1346(b), and 28 U.S.C. 2671 <u>et seq.</u> Under such statutes we have six months from the filing of a claim to make final disposition of it, and if such disposition is not made at the end of that time, the claimant may, at his option, file suit in Federal District Court against the United States (28 U.S.C. 2675). If the claim is denied, claimant has six months from the date of mailing of the notice of final denial to file suit in Federal District Court. (28 U.S.C. 2401 (b)). If no action is taken by claimant within that time, claimant is forever barred from further action in this matter.
