	Request for Destruction Authority for closed case files 29C-SL-185340 29J-SL-187240 29K-SL-187135 The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) is in the possession of three Federal Pre-Trial Diversion Program (FPDP) court orders, which mandate the removal of records related to the subjects of the court orders from the FBI's central records system Each of the case files pertain exclusively to the individuals, who are the subjects of the FPDP court orders. However, these cases may meet the criteria for permanent retention, if they are part of a systematic informational sample for file classification 29. However, the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has not yet determined the statistical sampling criteria for Universal Case File Number (UCFN) cases opened in classification 29. Additionally, file classification 29 cases not meeting the criteria for permanent retention may be destroyed when twenty years old. None of these cases have been closed for twenty years. Therefore, the FBI requests disposition authority to destroy these case files in order to comply with the requirements of the FPDP. DISPOSITION Destroy immediately upon approval
