	Request for Destruction Authority for two closed case files 29J-SF-118302 164B-TP-63625 The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has received two Federal Pre-Trial Diversion Program (FPDP) court orders, which mandate the removal of records related to the subjects of the court orders from the FBI's central records system. San Francisco case file 29J-SF-118302 and Tampa case file 164B-TP-63625 pertain exclusively to the subjects of the FPDP court orders. However, because the cases have not been closed for the minimum twenty (20) year period, neither is eligible for destruction. Therefore, the FBI requests disposition authority to destroy the case files in order to comply with the requirements of the FPDP. DISPOSITION: Destroy immediately upon approval.
