Deconfliction Database

WITHDRAWN

The Deconfliction Database stores information about the online monikers of online assets. The purpose of this database is twofold: to allow FBI personnel to deconflict online monikers and determine if a potential online target is actually a friendly asset, and to allow the FBI personnel to search for online assets with certain skill sets or other attributes. Information regarding the "true name" or other personal identifiable information of online assets is never stored in the database. The Deconfliction Database only stores the "symbol number" and contact agent for the online asset.

- 1 **Inputs:** Are keyed in directly by FBI personnel
Disposition: TEMPORARY Delete/destroy any source data after input to the system and validated as accurate and complete for the management of the asset.
- 2 **Outputs:** Includes but is not limited to query/export of online monikers lists and user interface. The outputs are used to advance the mission of the FBI and are included in the appropriate investigative case file.
Disposition: TEMPORARY Delete/destroy queries when no longer needed for analysis and verified as captured in the appropriate case file.
- 3 **Master file.** Files are closed once the asset has been deactivated or the FBI has been notified of death of the asset.
Disposition: PERMANENT Transfer closed files to the National Archives 75 years after the case closure and all declassification actions have been completed in a format to be determined at the time of transfer.
- 4 **System documentation,** including but not limited to system specifications, user guides, and privacy impact assessments.
Disposition: PERMANENT Delete/destroy when superseded or obsolete. Transfer a current set of the system documentation with the master file to the National Archives at the time of transfer. Provide the final set of system documentation to the Archives along with the transfer of the final set of data.

5. **System audit logs**—Logs that record actions from within the database to include changes, additions, and deletions of data in the database.
Disposition: TEMPORARY Delete/destroy when 25 years old, in accordance with N1-065-10-39
