I-791 VISA WAIVER PILOT INFORMATION FORM

The Visa Waiver Pilot Program Information Form was developed under section 217(b)(3) of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 for use under the Pilot Program. The Pilot Program will end on September 30, 1991. This form provides for: (a) a summary description of the conditions for excluding nonimmigrant visitors from the United States under section 212(a) and under the Pilot Program, (b) a description of the conditions of entry with a waiver under the pilot program, including the limitation of each entry to 90 days and the consequences of failure to abide by such conditions, and (c) questions for the alien to answer concerning any previous denial of the alien's application for a visa.

This is a pink three part tear-off form in various languages that will be used by aliens from designated countries entering

It is for use by carriers who wish to participate in the Visa Waiver Pilot Program and the agreement enables the carriers to transport aliens without visas specifically under the terms of the waiver program. Transportation lines are not permitted to land any alien into the United States under the Non-Immigrant Visa Waiver Pilot Program until and unless it has entered into such a contract.</p> <p>This is a single form consisting of two sides, and was developed under the authority of Sections 103 and 217 of the</p>

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
