Justification: These files are prefixed CO-followed by a numeric designation, however despite this different file scheme, these records are similar, if not identical, to the Central office subject correspondence, 1906-1957, 51648/3A - 56365/136 (with gaps) whose disposition is permanent according to job # N1-85-86-1. Therefore, I suggest that these records extend the previous disposition and be made permanent (with the understanding that during archival processing any housekeeping records covered by the GRS may be destroyed).

These files consist of correspondence referred to by the INS as "sundry and very inactive". These files consist of correspondence pertaining to questions and answers relating to INS policy on a variety of issues.

SUMMARY

The Department of Justice's Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) requests disposition authority for 5 series of records. As a result of the WNRC Project, one box of records was proposed for temporary retention. This series pertains to interim decisions of INS policies issued to the public for review and comment prior to adoption for the year 1954. Files do not reflect final decisions and contain no public comments. The 4 series proposed for permanent retention are the Central Office Policy/Subject Correspondence Files, 1957-1974, I-N 23/Files or 23/series, 1929-1944, Citizen Education Program Addresses, 1937-1961 and Hungarian Refugee Program, 1956-1957

A copy of this schedule was requested by Michael Tankersley of Public Citizens Litigation Group on the last day of the request period.

I recommend this schedule for approval.



The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) recently completed its review of records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Record Group (RG) 85, stored at the Washington National Records Center (WNRC) in Suitland, MD.


