The form has non-immigrant Arrival and Departure records which are processed under the new Non-immigrant Information System (NIIS) that became operational in January 1983.</p> <p><u>I-94 Non-immigrant Arrival Record (covering returning residents, new immigrants, & non-controlled aliens)*</u></p> <p>This a 4½ X 4½ tear-off section of the I-94 completed for each non-citizen entering the U.S., including returning residents, new immigrants, and non-controlled aliens. It contains an eleven digit pre-printed admission number and seven data fields which include name, date of birth, country of residence, and address while in the U.S. The back contains additional data fields completed by the immigration official for certain non-immigrant categories including occupation, school, itinerary, and petition number.</p> <p>* Clarification of description authorized by Victor Rodriguez, RAIB, INS. per telecom of Apr 15/83 <i>HW, 4/15/83</i></p>		<i>2 items</i>

	<p>I-94 Non-immigrant Departure Record (covering returning residents, new immigrants, & non-controlled aliens)*</p> <p>This is a 4½ X 3½ tear-off section of the I-94 completed for each non-immigrant leaving the U.S. It contains a matching eleven digit pre-printed admission number, name, date of birth, and country of citizenship. The back is used to record changes in status, port of departure, date, carrier, and flight number or ship name.</p> <p>This portion of the I-94 is discarded by the INS inspector for non-controlled aliens, returning residents, and new immigrants upon entry into the U.S.</p> <p>Form I-94 Arrival Records collected for returning residents, new immigrants, and non-controlled aliens will be sent to Document Processing facilities and handled separately from I-94s completed for non-immigrants.</p> <p>Destroy these documents after they are inspected by INS officials.</p>
