1.	<p>Case files relating to inmates confined in state and local institutions, 1961-68, arranged alphabetically by name of inmate and consisting of correspondence, occasional classification summaries and presentence reports, and a few FBI reports. WNRC Acc. No. 129-71A2154, Boxes 1-18.</p> <p>Approximately 50 percent of these files relate to the designation of institutions for confinement of D.C. prisoners, nearly all of whom were routinely assigned to Lorton and Occoquan under jurisdiction of the D.C. Department of Corrections. Another 30 percent of the files consist solely of notifications from U.S. Marshals and U.S. Probation Officers of the assignment of persons convicted of Federal offenses to state and local institutions for service of sentences. Perhaps 10 percent of the files cover requests by prisoners for transfers from state and local institutions to Federal penal facilities (nearly all such requests were turned aside). About five percent of the files consist solely of FBI reports of the outcome of legal proceedings involving Federal prisoners prosecuted for escaping from state and local custody.</p> <p>Disposition: Destroy January 1, <del>1989</del> 1999.</p>
