The Pardon Attorney receives and reviews all petitions for clemency, initiates the necessary investigations, and prepares the Attorney General's recommendations to the President. The Pardon Attorney numbering system for case files includes the calendar year, month, and a sequential number, e.g., 95-06-575.</p> <p><u>Pardon Attorney Case Files.</u></p> <p>a.
