

	<p>The authority of the International Claims Commission (ICC), the predecessor of the FCSC, was based upon the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949 [Pub. L. 81-455, approved March 10, 1950, 64 Stat. 12, 22 USC 1621], as amended. Under section 4(a) of Title 1 [64 Stat. 13, 22 USC 1623(a)], the ICC was authorized to adjudicate claims of nationals of the United States for the nationalization or other taking of property included within the terms of any claims settlement agreement hereafter concluded between the United States and a foreign government (exclusive of governments against which the United States declared the existence of a state of war during World War II). The Panamanian program stemmed from a decision of the Panamanian Supreme Court in 1931 which declared that a large tract of land known as El Encanto, owned by several American citizens and American-owned corporations, was the property of the Republic of Panama. Under the Convention of October 11, 1950, the government of Panama, without admission of liability, agreed to pay to the United States \$400,000 in settlement of all claims of American citizens who had acquired land in El Encanto. The program was concluded on December 31, 1954.</p>
