	Administrative Law judges preside over formal hearings to determine wage violations of the minimum wage requirements; overtime payments; health and safety regulations; all set forth under the Walsh-Healey Public Contract Act, McNamara-O'Hara Service contract Act, Contract Work Hours Standards Act, Farm Labor contractor Registration Act of 1963, and the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act. Formal hearings are also conducted to determine the validity of claims filed under the district of Columbia workmen's Compensation Act, the Non-

Designated Judges also serve as members of the department of Labor Board of Contracts Appeals and the National Review Panel, the latter being the highest appellate level for hearings and appeals required by the Talmadge Amendments to the social Security Act.
