1. Adoptions Tracking Service (ATS)

Description:

ATS is an electronic information system designed to track, monitor, and report on all adoption cases involving emigration from or immigration to the U.S as mandated by the Intercountry Adoption Act of 2000 (IAA). Activities include monitoring organizations that provide intercountry adoption services, responding to adoption-related inquiries from the public and other interested stakeholders, reporting to Congressional representatives on inter-country adoptions involving U.S. citizens, producing mandatory annual reports to Congress, and communicating with all inter-country adoption stakeholders.

ATS supports the U S Central Authority for Inter-country Adoptions (USCA), which has inter-country adoption-related responsibilities involving U.S. citizens The IAA designated the Department of State as U.S. Central Authority for Inter-country Adoptions under the Hague Adoption Convention. The day-to-day work of the U S. Central Authority is the responsibility of the Bureau of Consular Affairs, Directorate of Overseas Citizens Services, Office of Children's Issues (CA/OCS/CI).

ATS records include the following types of information unique identifier, case status and tracking information, application information, adoptive parent information, child information, Hague Convention documentation, inquiry and complaint information, and adoption agency information

Disposition:

Temporary Cut off at end of calendar year when adoption case closes.

Destroy 75 years after adoption case closed.

Pending
