Washington, D.C. and at Cameron and Union Streets, Alexandria, Virginia. The contractor's services consisted of reviewing groups of files and locating all documents dealing with a selected group of subjects (approximately 25 categories) plus other related duties. The contract was the result of a court order requiring FOA to produce certain records in connection with the Arab Oil Litigation, the production of which involved considerable searching in the FOA Washington, D.C. offices and in the Federal Records Centers where FOA records were stored. The files include correspondence, memorandums, reports, lists, and working papers relating to the execution of the search.
