1.	<p>Immediate disposal is requested for the records described below for the Eastern Region, Minerals Management Service, which are usually covered by NCL-57-78-1, Item 800-10. <u>Geophysical Data Tapes.</u> Magnetic tapes containing data created from analog magnetic tape or recorded directly on magnetic digital tape for scientific measurements of geophysical phenomena.</p> <p>DISPOSAL INSTRUCTIONS:</p> <p>Cut off when all data required by the related permit or contract have been submitted. Hold 15 years and transfer to FARC. Destroy 25 years after cutoff.</p> <p>There are approximately 5,000 magnetic tapes containing raw high-resolution geophysical data created on shipboard by various contractors for the Minerals Management Service. The data on these tapes were used in the investigations for potential geologic hazards on the Atlantic OCS. The raw data were processed by the contractors in their computer centers. The end products of processing are the high resolution record sections and microfilms. ^{Although these} these magnetic tapes are of no use and can be destroyed because the data has been microfilmed.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Destroy immediately.</i></p>
