This Act established the disability relief program that authorized payments of cash relief to non-U.S. citizen employees of the Panama Canal Company and its predecessor agencies who were disabled due to age or illness and who had served at least 10 years with the organization. The Act was amended in 1970 to include COLA's to provide survivor benefits to widows and common-law spouses, as well as U.S. Government subsidized health care benefits.
