Final Disposition of the case usually took the form of a memorandum to the President stating the findings and usually offering suggested solutions. Cases from 1958-1973 are unarranged, contain considerable duplication, have been completed — usually with recommendations to the President, are found both in the Department of the Treasury and in WNRC under several accessions transferred by the Office of Emergency Preparedness. Some case records are not able to be separated from Preparedness files. This function was transferred from the Office of Emergency Preparedness to the Secretary of Treasury by Executive Order 11725, Section 2, June 27, 1973.</p> <p>DISPOSITION: Destroy files located in the Department after 1983.
