Bound photostatic and mimeographed copies of authorization letters described in item #1 as well as copies of authorization letters sent by President Roosevelt to Secretary of the Treasury for appropriations governed by the Emergency Relief Acts of 1939-41. Nature of letters pertaining to the 1939-41 Acts are identical to the letters described in item #1.

3. Presidential Authorization Letters, 1935-36

Pertaining solely to the Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of 1935, the letters consist of signed originals sent by President Roosevelt to the Secretary of the Treasury authorizing either the appropriation or the rescission of funds to Federal agencies such as the Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce, Department of Justice, Department of Labor, Navy Department, and War Department. Copies of the letters can be found in items #1 and #2.

4. WPA Transfer Letters, 1940-41

(D401 - D920 and E1 - E639). Original signed letters from Corrington Gill, Assistant Commissioner of the WPA to the Secretary of the Treasury detailing the transfer of appropriated funds from one authorized WPA project to another.
