Spartacus is an electronic case management system used by OFI personnel to facilitate the criminal investigative process. Spartacus is a central repository of data containing personnally identifiable information (PII) and law-enforcement sensitive but unclassified information. The system contains material gathered and/or created during the criminal investigative process by NHTSA personnel and/or other Federal, state, and local enforcement/regulatory agencies. Individuals covered by Spartacus includes: private citizens; government agents; complainants; victims; witnesses; confidential and non-confidential informants; individuals investigated and/or interviewed; persons suspected of administrative, civil, and or/criminal provisions; and defendants in civil and/or criminal matters. Categories of records may include: complaints: information contained in criminal, civil, or administrative referrals; statements from subjects, targets, and/or witnesses; affidavitis, transcripts, police reports, Photographs, and/or documents relative to a subject's prior criminal record; incident reports; materials and intelligence information from other governmental investigatory or law enforcement organizations; information relative to the status of a particular complaint or investigation, including any determination relative to criminal prosecution, civil or administrative action; general case management documentation; subpoenas and evidence obtained in response to subpoenas; evidence logs; pen registers; correspondence; records of seized property; reports of laboratory examination; reports of investigation; and other data or evidence collected or generated by NHTSA's OFI during the course of conducting its official duties. The material contained in Spartacus may contain the following PII data elements: full name and present address (including ZIP code), email address, IP address, login name and/or digital identity; date-of-birth; phone number, SSN, driver's license number, FBI Number, State Identification Number (SID), financial account numbers; birthplace, aliases, group/gang affiliation, photographs and/or images; employment information; criminal and/or civil records; motor vehicle records. Such PII may be stored in database fields, spreadsheets, and/or text documents. Title 49 U.S.C. 32706 authorizes the maintenance of Spartacus, an investigative case management system containing non-PII, PII, SPII, and law enforcement sensitive but unclassified information concerning individuals involved with investigations conducted by NHTSA's OFI during the course of its official duties. Spartacus is designed to ensure that NHTSA personnel are efficiently managing odometer fraud investigations and deploying the technology necessary to manage privacy effectively while achieving its mission of reducing the economic costs associated with odometer fraud and helping to ensure the dafety of the Nation's highways.
