	<p>This appraisal report covers unscheduled records retired to the Boston Federal Records Center by Region I of the Federal Civil Defense Administration.</p> <p>1. <u>Natural Disaster Reports</u>, Ca. 1953-57, 2 cu.ft.</p> <p>Reports, surveys, studies, correspondence, fiscal data, and other materials relating to the Worcester tornado of 1953, and the hurricanes that hit New England in 1954 and 1955, causing severe flooding. Included are damage reports and surveys, reports on regional impact, correspondence on funding for disaster relief, and federal assistance programs. There is also data on the FCDA role in a forest fire emergency in Massachusetts in 1957. Series includes some duplication of records, and some routine data on fiscal accounting; this material can be screened out during archival processing.</p>

Included are studies on the expansion and relocation to the suburbs of hospitals; correspondence and reports on the relocation of vital industries; evacuation exercises and reports; data on a radiation experiment in Boston Harbor; reports on regional food supplies, petroleum logistics, and general resource analysis; and a guide to radiological defense planning. 6. Regional Meetings and Conferences, ca. 1950-60, 1.5 cu.ft.

Records of meetings and conferences of numerous FCDA regional organizations covering various civil defense activities. Included are the record copies of minutes of meetings of ongoing FCDA organizations, such as the mobilization committee and the advisory council; membership included representatives of other Federal agencies in the region. The series also documents regional conferences on specific topics under the aegis of civil defense, including medicine and public health; emergency housing; facilities protection; welfare; transportation; and rescue. Other FCDA regional conferences brought together state officials to discuss specific civil defense matters; among these were conferences of state directors and of state attorneys general. Therefore, the material documents relationships between individual states and the regional office.

Materials reflect results of simulated nuclear attack, documenting casualties; fallout; damage to buildings, transportation equipment, food supplies, etc.; state government operations; volume of refugees; and similar aspects of nuclear war's aftermath. There is much duplication of records, and a large quantity of non-records, generally items sent out from Washington, and reference copies of national, state, and local publications, as well as several NATO bulletins. Other disposable material consists of routine correspondence, documenting the day-to-day housekeeping activities of the agency; and budget records, such as funding matters, bills of lading, equipment data reports, and similar routine, short-term items.
