13. Public Affairs Private Sector Advisory Committee System.
The purpose of this application was to keep track of all trade committees, both in the public and private sector.
This was a dynamically changing list that was used as a mailing list for USTR issuances.

Delete when no longer needed for administrative, legal, audit, or other operational purposes (GRS 20, Item 3.a.).

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14. Rolodex System. The purpose of this application was to keep track of current USTR personnel by name, address, internal and external telephone numbers. This list was used for internal USTR purposes only. This was a dynamically changing list.

DISPOSITION: TEMPORARY

Delete when 2 years old or when no longer needed, whichever is sooner (GRS 23, Item 1).

15. Room Reservation System. The purpose of this application was to keep track of the USTR conference rooms and their availability for meetings and purpose of the meetings.

DISPOSITION: TEMPORARY

Delete when 2 years old or when no longer needed, whichever is sooner (GRS 23, Item 1., and GRS 20, Item 3.a.).

16. Security Files. This system generated data that was used to monitor user attempts to access any computer resource from outside the USTR; also contribed a log file of all accesses to the system using dial-up and a security report file on every day log-in errors.

DISPOSITION: TEMPORARY

Delete when no longer needed for administrative, legal, audit, or other operational purposes (CRS 20, Item 1.c.).

17. Travel System. The purpose of this application was to keep track of USTR travel costs by sections within USTR.

DISPOSITION: TEMPORARY

Delete when no longer needed for administrative, legal, audit, or other operational purposes (GRS 20, Item 3.a.).

18. Weekly Usage Reports. This system generated data that was used to monitor system usage.

DISPOSITION: TEMPORARY

Delete when no longer needed for administrative, legal, audit, or other operational purposes (GRS 20, Item 1.c.).

- 2. Training Routines and HELP Files. These WordPerfect interactive training routines allowed the users to become familiar with the various functions on the systems. The WordPerfect HELP file contained text to assist users as they executed their applications.
