Description:

The Council on International Economic Policy (CIEP) was established, effective January 19, 1971, by a memorandum from President Richard M. Nixon to the newly appointed members of the CIEP dated January 18, 1971. The Council was given statutory recognition by the International Economic Policy Act (86 Stat. 646), approved August 29, 1972. It was an interagency council of the Executive Office of the President. The Council considered the full spectrum of international economic policies including trade, investment, balance of payments, and finance, and coordinated these issues with basic foreign policy objectives. The Council was abolished on September 30, 1977, by Reorganization Plan No. 1 of 1977.

Beginning each year, individual folders were numbered in chronological sequence.</p> <p>Correspondence, internal memoranda, reports, news clippings, and routing sheets concerning all phases of the work of CIEP. Subjects include but are not limited to Administration, Aviation, Budget, Energy, Export and Import Controls, Foreign Investment, Speeches, Studies, and Trade. Correspondence is with Congress, Executive branch agencies, and private business concerns. For the years 1971-1974, original CIEP records were filed in the White House Central files. Although the CIEP central files include a complete duplicate set of documents for 1973 and 1974, no duplicates were made for 1971 and 1972. CIEP annual reports were gathered together and filed under number 243 in the 1976 records.</p>

For each year, there is available a master list of files in numerical order and name, country, organization and keyword indices in alphabetical order. In addition, an alphabetical subject index was prepared for the years 1974 - 1977. All indices for a given year are bound in a single volume except that those for 1974 are broken into two volumes, one volume for the keyword index and one for all others.</p>
