## Description:

The Council on International Economic Policy (CIEP) was established, effective Janaury 19, 1971, by a memorandum from President Richard M. Nixon to the newly appointed members of the CIEP dated January 18, 1971. The Council was given statutory recognition by the International Economic Policy Act (86 Stat. 646), approved August 29, 1972. It was an interagency council of the Executive Office of the President. The Council considered the full spectrum of international economic policies including trade, investment, balance of payments, and finance, and coordinated these issues with basic foreign policy objectives. The Council was abolished on September 30, 1977, by Reorganization Plan No. 1 of 1977.
