1.	<p>This job amends the provisions of the General Records Schedules which presently limit the applicability of the various disposal authorizations to those records created <u>after</u> a specific time period.</p> <p>Agencies may now destroy records based on the disposal authorizations in these schedules without any further concurrence from the National Archives and Records Service (GSA), except that any records created <u>prior</u> to the specific dates, as given in the individual schedules must first be offered to the National Archives for permanent retention. If the offer is rejected, the records may be disposed of by the agency without further authorization from the National Archives.</p> <p>The paragraphs in the individual schedules and the general introduction will be so amended before they are reissued. The specific exclusion of certain types of records as called for in the individual schedules is continued in force.</p>
