- 5 Correspondence of the Postal Inspection Service, 1870s-1950s. Unarranged. Approximately 1 cubic foot. Located in USPS storage space.

Correspondence from the central office and regional offices of the Postal Inspection Service that document the activities of the Service.

- 6 Newsclippings Relating to Cases Investigated by the Inspection Service, 1920s-60s. Approximately 1/2 cubic foot. Unarranged. Located in USPS storage space.

This series consists of newclippings in scrapbooks and loose newsclippings relating to some of the more sensational postal crimes investigated by the Inspection Service.

Disposition. PERMANENT. Transfer immediately to the National Archives upon approval of this schedule.

- 7 Chronological Files of the Postal Inspection Service, 1926-1960. Arranged chronologically (one year of correspondence is attached to each Acco Binder). Approximately 1 cubic foot. Located in USPS storage space.

- 8 Daily Log of Presidential Mail Pouches, 1939-1952. Unarranged (one year of logged mail in separate Acco binders, however, binders are unarranged). Approximately 1/2 cubic foot. Located in USPS storage space.

The records in this series document the incoming and outgoing mail of the President of the United States.

- 9 Diaries of Postal Inspectors, 1920s-1933. Unarranged. Approximately 2 inches. Located in USPS storage

space.

The records in this series consist of eleven diaries, approximately 6" x 3" and about 1/4 inch thick, belonging to Postal Inspectors and is a log of their more important activities within a given year.

Disposition. PERMANENT. Transfer immediately to the National Archives upon approval of this schedule.

- 10 Roster of Postal Inspectors, n.d. Two large, leather-bound volumes. Located in USPS storage space.

These two volumes list the Postal Inspectors employed with the Post Office Department from the late nineteenth century through the early twentieth century.

Disposition. PERMANENT. Transfer immediately to the National Archives upon approval of this schedule.

- 11 Letters Sent, 1879. One bound volume. Located in USPS storage space.

This book contain copies of outgoing correspondence relating to investigative cases and the daily operation of the Inspection Service sent by the Postal Inspector during 1879. There is in index to the correspondence in the front of the volume.

- 12 Reports and Logs of the Postal Inspection Service, 1879-1950s. Approximately 1/2 cubic foot. Located in USPS storage space.

The records in this series include the Inspection Service's "Murder Book," a report titled "Justification for Inspector's Salaries (1943), a report on postal crimes in Alabama in the 1940s and the log book of David B. Parker, Chief Special Agent of the Post Office Department, 1879-1880.
