Description:

The Works Progress Administration (WPA) was established by Executive Order 7034 of May 6, 1935, under authority of the Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of 1935. The name was changed to the Work Projects Administration on July 1, 1939, by Reorganization Plan I, which provided for the consolidation of the WPA into the Federal Works Agency. A December 4, 1942 letter of the President to the Federal Works Administrator authorized its liquidation.

1.	<p>Records relating to the Work Projects Administration (WPA) and the National Youth Administration (NYA) among the records of the National Park Service stored in the Boston Federal Records Center.</p> <p><u>PWA/NYA Scrapbooks</u>, ca. 1935-42, 6 cu. ft.</p> <p>Nine scrapbooks on WPA/NYA activities. Seven books relate to a public relations project called "This Work Pays Your Community Week" held across New England in May 1941. The project was designed to show the numerous benefits a town derived from the local operations of the Professional and Service Division of the WPA, which provided white-collar employment. The scrapbooks document the objectives, operations, and attainments of the various WPA projects in each community. They contain newspaper clippings, copies of local proclamations, radio scripts, samples of souvenirs, reports and photographs. They are arranged by town or by type of items contained in the scrapbooks. The other two scrapbooks contain news articles on NYA activities in New England and New York State.
