The Bureau assists the Commission in recognizing the presence, nature, and significance of economic issues and problems in the industries it regulates and as they arise in the process of regulation; improves the quality of the evidence and analysis submitted on such issues in proceedings and the quality of the scrutiny to which such evidence is subjected; and assists the Commission in the formulation and evaluation of policy on the basis of sound economic principles and evidence.
