WNRC Accession Number 72-A-1986, boxes 2 (part), 10, 11 (part), 13 (part), 14 (part) 15 (part).</p> <p>The records in this series consist of the questionnaire responses by the National Broadcast Corporation (NBC), American Broadcast Corporation (ABC), and Columbia Broadcast System (CBS). The questionnaire was initiated to facilitate the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) study of network broadcasting. Responses address such subjects as advertising, network contracts with affiliates, and program production.</p> <p><u>Disposition.</u> PERMANENT. Transfer immediately to the National Archives upon approval of this schedule in 1996.</p>

- 2 **Non-Network Producer Questionnaires, 1958.** 2.5 cubic feet. Arranged in rough alphabetical order by company name. WNRC Accession Number 72-A-1986, boxes 17, 18, 19 (part).

These records are the questionnaire responses of independent production companies including Warner Brothers, Walt Disney as well as less well known producers. The questionnaire was initiated to facilitate the FCC study of radio and network broadcasting. Information provided includes ownership and capital structure as well as management and production facilities information.

These are case files for two dockets related to the Office of Network Study's examination network broadcasting. Docket 12782 concerns hearings which took place between September 5-22, 1961. Its files include copies of statements, newspaper clippings, and background statistics on specific program advertisers. Docket 12285 concerns the relationship between networks and affiliates. Records include "exhibits" of materials submitted by the networks, printed reports of proceedings and statements of witnesses from both the network and affiliates.
