/	<p>Original letters of protest and endorsement (1) received in response to a petition (2) filed with the Federal Communications Commission by Lorenzo Milam and Jeremy Lansman dated December 2, 1974.</p> <p>This petition seeks a series of changes in the Commission's rules relating to the standards applicable to the licensing and operation of educational stations on reserved frequency modulation (FM) or television channels. In particular, petitioners seek the commencement of an inquiry leading toward changes in the rules to place certain limitations on which educational organizations might be considered eligible to hold station authorizations.</p> <p><u>Formal filings and Congressional correspondence</u> are a matter of record in Rulemaking File No. RM-2493 and <u>are not to be considered</u> for disposal in this listing. They will be disposed of in accordance with existing records control schedules.</p> <p><u>Volume</u> - While the Commission's Memorandum Opinion and Order (FCC 75-946) adopted August 1, 1975 (3) indicates that the petition has generated in excess of 700,000 letters, the Chief, Administrative Services Division, now estimates the current volume is more than 2,000,000 with additional filings still being received.</p>	<p>1 2</p> <p>3</p>
