The Advisory Commission on Conferences in Ocean Shipping (ACCOS) was a 16-member panel established by Section 18 of the Shipping Act of 1984, as amended by Public Law 101-595 (November 16, 1990), (46 USC App. 1717). The Commission charter was effective February 15, 1991. Composed of 8 members from Congress and 8 members from the private industry sector, its purpose was to examine international ocean liner conferences and to determine whether antitrust immunity for these conferences was in the nationes best interest. Specifically, whether the nation would be better served by prohibiting conferences, or by closed or open conferences. The Commission held five public hearings across the United States and several meetings in Washington, D.C. to discuss various industry-related topics, and invited written submissions from private citizens and organizations. It submitted a final report to the President and to the Congress on April 10, 1992. The commission was terminated on May 10, 1992. (See attached sheets)
