Dear Mr. Wells:

We have received your memorandum regarding the fire at the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Challis Field Office, located at 1151 Blue Mountain Road in Challis, Idaho, on October 4, 2016.

While we understand that the full damage report will not be completed by the independent recovery contractor until June 30, 2017, NARA is requesting that BLM, in accordance with 36 CFR 1230.16(b), provide us with an interim report regarding the records that were removed by the contractor for restoration and digitization, or destroyed completely by the fire.

NARA is requesting a response within 30 calendar days that includes an inventory of the records affected by the fire. Please include in your response all available information that is pertinent to the description of the records, including but not limited to the specific file names and descriptions, types of media affected (i.e., paper, photographic, drawings, video, audio, electronic, etc.), approximate volume for each record series, and the disposition authority number for each record series.
