Dear Ms. George:

The National Archives and Records Administration received a phone call from a staff member of the Bureau of Prisons alleging that one of your locations, FCI Aliceville, is “not maintaining official records properly,” “losing some records,” and “falsifying government records.” Specifically, the allegation indicated that the “mobile log books” are damaged and losing pages and these books are not being replaced in accordance with the bureau’s policies; daily assignment logs are being falsified and/or “lost or misplaced;” and the paper “unit logs” are missing and/or have been falsified. The caller also stated that there were rumors that books were lost prior to federal inspector site visits.

In accordance with 36 CFR 1230.14, NARA requests that you respond to this letter within 30 business days and provide us with the following information for any records that may have been destroyed without disposition authorization:

- a description of the records, including the dates that the records were created and approximate volume of the missing records;
- a description of the office that created and maintained the records;
- a statement of the safeguards established to prevent further loss of documentation; and
- all details of the actions taken to salvage, retrieve, or reconstruct the records.
