The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) acknowledges receipt of EOIR's report dated August 6, 2025, regarding the unauthorized disposition of video surveillance footage at the Santa Ana Immigration Court for a period of approximately three years and eight months starting in November 2021.

According to EOIR's report, the servers on which the surveillance footage were maintained were improperly configured to retain surveillance footage at the court for only 24 hours, rather than the 30 days required under the applicable records schedule. NARA understands that EOIR has deemed the footage unrecoverable. EOIR is managing video surveillance footage using General Records Schedule (GRS) 5.6, Item 090 (DAA-GRS-2021-0001-0003).

NARA understands that surveillance footage of courtroom hallways and waiting areas was recorded on 41 different cameras at the Santa Ana facility for security purposes. NARA further understands that the premature deletion of this footage became known as a result of a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request EOIR received.

EOIR reports that it has taken steps to prevent further unauthorized disposition of video surveillance records. It has adjusted settings to ensure a 30-day retention of video surveillance footage. It has also provided refresher training to staff members on records retention obligations.

Based on this information, the reporting requirements of 36 CFR 1230.14(a) have been met and NARA considers this matter closed. I appreciate your attention to this matter.
