Dear Mr. Brewer:

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has received an allegation of unauthorized disposition of Department of Justice (DOJ) records. A November 17, 2025 letter from U.S. Representative Jamie Raskin alleges that the head of DOJ's "Weaponization Working Group," used personal devices and platforms, including applications that automatically delete messages after they are sent, to conduct official government business. The letter states that federal records were not preserved in accordance with the Federal Records Act and DOJ policies.

In accordance with 36 CFR 1230.14(a), NARA requests that the DOJ respond within 30 calendar days to this allegation. If it is determined that an unauthorized disposition of records has occurred, the response should include the following information:

- A complete description of the records with volume and dates, if known;
- The office or offices maintaining the records;
- A statement of the exact circumstances surrounding the removal, defacing, alteration, or destruction of records;
- A statement of the safeguards established to prevent further loss of documentation; and
- Details of the actions taken to salvage, retrieve, or reconstruct the records.

If it is determined that there has been no unauthorized disposition, please provide us with sufficient information to support that finding. I appreciate your attention to this matter.
