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Patients and Staff at St. Elizabeths Hospital (The Government Hospital for the Insane) in the Federal Census, 1860–1940

In 1855, the Government Hospital for the Insane began operations to provide treatment to the mentally ill. Congress originally established the hospital to care for soldiers, sailors, and indigent residents of the District of Columbia. If vacancies existed, the hospital also accepted additional patients for a fee. Early on, people referred to the hospital as St. Elizabeths after a nearby tract of land, and in July 1916, Congress officially named it St. Elizabeths.

Enumerating the Staff and Patients

When enumerators took the Federal census for the District of Columbia, they recorded information about who was living at institutions in the District as well as the District's fulltime residents. The enumerations included the staff and patients at St. Elizabeths Hospital. The hospital appears in the 1860–1910 census schedules as either the Government Hospital for the Insane or the National Asylum for the Insane. The 1890 census schedule is no longer extant. In the 1920, 1930, and 1940 censuses, the hospital appears as St. Elizabeths Hospital.

The 1860–1920 censuses identify people as employees or patients. Sometimes the enumerator identified patients as inmates. The 1930 and 1940 censuses identify hospital staff. The patients are listed as "patient," and there is no occupation listed.
